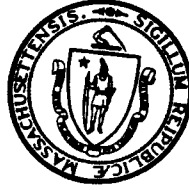

A Proclamation

By His Excellency

GOVERNOR MITT ROMNEY

2004

WHEREAS:

Gay youth and their straight supporters are joining together on May 15th, 2004, for the Tenth Annual Gay/Straight Youth Pride March; and

WHEREAS:

Gay and straight youth lobbied for and won passage of landmark legislation that prohibits discrimination against gay and lesbian students in Massachusetts public schools – legislation that was signed into law in December of 1993; and

WHEREAS:

Young people, particularly gays and lesbians, are at high risk for suicide, abuse of drugs and alcohol, and running away from home; and

WHEREAS:

Massachusetts is home to the Governor's Commission on Gay and Lesbian Youth, which supports the Commonwealth's gay and lesbian youth through school-based and educational programs; and

WHEREAS:

On May 15th, 2004, the Gay/Straight Youth Pride March celebrates the Commonwealth's commitment to providing a healthy environment for all students in Massachusetts' public schools,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MITT ROMNEY, Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, do hereby proclaim May 15th, 2004, to be

MASSACHUSETTS GAY/STRAIGHT YOUTH PRIDE DAY

and urge all the citizens of the Commonwealth to take cognizance of this event and participate fittingly in its observance.
