OUR PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND LIBRARIES ARE STREAMING PORN AT CHILDREN

Schools and libraries across the state are sponsoring EBSCO, NOVELIST, and other K-12 databases which have been outed as marketing for the 95 billion dollar sex industry - to a captive audience of children.

The EBSCO nightmare was exposed by **MassResistance** last fall, and the scandal has continued to grow as media outlets in Colorado and around the country have picked up the story.

Try checking out more fun and women-friendly films such as those directed by Comstock Films (try Xana and Dax, www.comstockfilms.com) or Candida Royalle (try Stud Hunters, www.royalle.com). This is a great way to take some fear out of porn, and it really can bring you and your partner closer together.

Children's Homework Databases are Soliciting Minors with Articles such as EBSCO's "Ethical Pornography..."

Jim Duncan of the "CLiC"

(Colorado Library Consortium) is running 6 million dollars worth of EBSCO through our state's libraries and schools with the help of Colorado taxpayer funding.

"EBSCO Culture" glamorizes **"porn stars"**, and encourages use of pornography as "educational"...even luring children to live links for hard core porn sites, as well as hundreds of sexually graphic ads for the 15 billion dollar "sex toy" industry.

Members of our chapter have collected screenshots of obscene EBSCO material and forwarding them to District administrators through letters, phone calls, social media, and through public presentations at board meetings.

Libraries and schools all across Colorado harbor this material - Cherry Creek, Aurora Public, Denver Public, Douglas County, JeffCo, Adams County, Pikes Peak, Mesa County, Prowers County (Lamar), etc. This is an issue that profoundly impacts all school-aged children who attend public schools and who might use public libraries for homework. EBSCO is just the tip of the iceberg - many other K-12 "homework databases" have been found to stream porn at kids.

Colorado MassResistance has the CLiC in our sights and we are leveraging pressure from a variety of pulse points, including grassroots activism and raising awareness among Colorado legislators. It is vital to converge on the CLiC from library districts across the state.
