Regarding Hales Corners Police Incident Report numbered 25-6108

Dear Ms.

It has been brought to the attention of my Department and it is our understanding that you led a contingent of citizens voicing concerns at a meeting of the Hales Corners Library Board on the evening of Thursday, August 28th, 2025 at the Hales Corners Library, 5885 South 116 Street.

This letter is being written because concurrent to that meeting an act of graffiti occurred at the same location. This letter is not meant to be an accusation; however, the message chalked on Village owned property which is ostensibly consistent with the comments spoken during the meeting.

While the Department stands in honor of any citizen's right to speak on a subject of public interest it is also incumbent upon it to assure that those who wish to exercise their right are aware of the parameters of their speech. To that end please note that Municipal Code Chapter 320 Peoce and Good Order prohibits messaging in a vandalus manner. For the utmost clarity an excerpt of the ordinance is included here -

§320-20. Groffiti.

A. Graffiti defined. "Graffiti" means any inscription, word, figure or design marked, scratched, etched, drawn or painted with spray paint, liquid paint, ink, chalk, dye or other similar substances on buildings, fences, structures and other similar places, without the express written consent of the owner or operator of the property.

8. Prohibited conduct. No person may write, paint or draw any inscription, figure or mark of any type on any public or private building or other real or personal property owned, operated or maintained by any public or private person, entity, agency, firm or corporation, unless the express permission of the owner or operator of the property has been obtained.

This community has always satisfactorily resolved issues no matter how contentious without law enforcement intervention because everyone involved has maintained proper decorum and respected the process by which solutions are achieved. I would kindly ask that you please give this notice due consideration and freely share this with anyone involved in this matter for that tradition to continue.
